

New Strategic Plan for Worcester Public Schools is Approved by School Committee

On December 21, 2023, the Worcester School Committee unanimously voted to approve the **2023-2028 Strategic Plan**. The initial draft of the plan had been introduced to the Standing Committee on Governance and Employee Issues on November 28, receiving unanimous approval to progress to the full School Committee for thorough review and discussion on December 7. Following minor revisions, the conclusive plan received approval on December 21.

Worcester Education Collaborative, along with Worcester Regional Research Bureau and members of the Worcester community, and in concert with the Worcester Public Schools, developed the strategy as a promise to students to improve our public schools and ensure that all students are prepared for success after graduation.





Recent Happenings

Worcester Education Equity Roundtable (WEER)

The Worcester Education Collaborative (WEC) was selected by Abt Associates to receive probono technical assistance services for the 2023 Fiscal Year to help assess the health of the Roundtable (WEER), as well as to evaluate the quality and impact of WEER/WEC events.

Key findings and recommendations were discussed at a monthly Roundtable meeting and presented in a final brief. **View the brief here.**

Supporting Parent Engagement

WEER efforts are also underway to support expanded parent engagement across the district including:

- Regular meetings with new district Family & Community Engagement co-directors to support and coordinate with their plans.
- Organizing two community conversations on family engagement needs and strategies involving WEER partners and Worcester parents.
- Sponsoring a two-part workshop for parents and community members on achieving equity in education conducted by the Collaborative Parent Leadership Action Network (CPLAN) with workshops to be repeated later this spring.
- Plans for providing training to promote more active school sites councils with more engaged parents.
- Plans to establish a Roundtable Parent Advisory Group to parent perspectives on Roundtable priorities and plans.

Launch of New Allied Communications Group

This coming spring, WEER partners will launch a new Allied Communications Group to unify strategic communication partners at the district level. The goal is to support the existing work of the communication leaders within WEC, the school district, Roundtable organizations, and other community organizations by coordinating efforts to share key messaging and viewpoints with an expanded audience, as well as share content related to the district with more frequency in order to amplify the work being done by individual partners throughout the district. The group is currently soliciting interest from WEER member organizations and other youth-serving organizations throughout the district. WEC Releases New Video: Woo-Labs Project-Based Learning at Guild of St. Agnes

By 6th grade, low income students have 6,000 fewer hours of learning compared to their middle-income peers. Researchers estimate this gap accounts for up to two-thirds of achievement differences.

This is a problem we can solve, and Woo-Labs is one solution.

Reading Together

Citywide Literacy Efforts Continue

Worcester Education Collaborative continues its dedicated efforts to foster a love for literacy among local elementary school students and their families. Through our continued partnership with seven local elementary schools and seven former teachers, WEC has successfully provided more than 1400 books to students this year, contributing to the building of home libraries.

Highlighting the success of the Summer Reading Together program, WEC reached over 700 students, equipping them with five books each alongside summer literacy packs. In addition, the program has distributed more than 250 backpacks and essential school supplies, and hosted 12 family literacy events so far this year.

The impact of WEC's Reading Together program extends beyond the distribution of books and supplies. With 77 classrooms already visited, the organization continues to engage with students across the district to help foster a high-quality literacy experience for all children. A second round of reading and book distribution is scheduled for this February.

The Inaugural John E. Bassett Symposium



Worcester Education Collaborative hosted its inaugural John E. Bassett Symposium on Monday, November 13, at the Beechwood Hotel. The event, named to honor WEC's founder, featured a fireside chat with Dr. Rachel Monárrez, Superintendent of Worcester Public Schools, and Dr. Gisele Shorter, President & CEO of the Nellie Mae Education Foundation, who discussed their lessons learned as leaders in education. Paul Reville, Professor of Practice at the Harvard Graduate School of Education, and former Secretary of Education served as the moderator for the discussion.

Jennifer Davis Carey, Executive Director of WEC, opened the evening with a reminder that Worcester finds itself in a once-in-a-generation inflection point, and applauded the new superintendent and her team for their work to capture this important moment in history for the city, and their courage to be fearless in making change.

"Worcester, the second largest city in New England and growing, is at an inflection point. With new leadership open to what is possible, new funding through the state Student Opportunity Act, and a new configuration of and membership on the School Committee, we are at a once in a generation moment to make substantive, long term meaningful change in our education system and by doing so, assure a strong a vibrant future for our city and its residents," she said.

The fireside chat specifically called attention to the importance of building relationships with business and civic leaders when developing responsive, equitable approaches to education that best serve the needs of all students.

John E. Bassett, honored guest of the evening, closed the program with a nod to the City's ecosystem and its unique ability to respond to today's challenges in education.
