

Worcester Education Collaborative Woo-Labs Hanover Fellowship Academic Year 2022-2023 Position Description

Do you enjoy working with children and being part of a team?

Are you planning to pursue a career in youth development or teaching and looking for an exciting, hands-on experience working directly with youth to support learning and enrichment?

<u>Worcester Education Collaborative</u> (WEC) seeks undergraduate and/or graduate students to apply for its Hanover Fellowship. Hanover Fellows serve at WEC's partner youth-serving organizations to support program implementation and enhance program offerings. The Fellowship couples hand-on work with students running PBL with meaningful professional development. This position is ideal for those passionate about positive youth development and eager to expand their ability to facilitate meaningful, authentic learning experiences for young people under the mentorship of experienced out-of-school time programming professionals.

WEC has launched "<u>Woo-Labs</u>," a network of community-based partners advancing educational and racial equity and closing opportunity and achievement gaps by providing high-quality, culturally responsive, project-based learning opportunities for Worcester Public School K-6 students. Drawing its name from residents' nickname for their city, Woo-Labs reimagines education as an ecosystem that includes out-of-school learning, centers students' lived experiences and agency, and actively works to dismantle bias and inequity.

This school year, Hanover Fellows will serve at Woo-Labs partner organizations focusing on the following three foundational strategies:

- 1. Providing student-centered, project-based learning opportunities
- 2. Applying a common measurement framework to support program improvement
- 3. Promoting students' social emotional skills

Fellows commit to serving 225 hours over the course of the school year. The majority of hours (approximately 180) are spent working directly at the partner site with whom Fellows match (see below) to execute these strategies, with a focus on building capacity for project-based learning opportunities and measurement. In their remaining 45 hours, Fellows engage in Woo-Labs' "Community of Practice," ongoing professional development with fellow members of the Woo-Labs ecosystem to expand their knowledge of youth development best practices. The Community of Practice includes targeted training and discussion on topics such as project-based learning and fostering trauma-sensitive environments as well as opportunities to visit and learn from fellow Woo-Labs partner sites. Fellows also receive comprehensive pre-service training and ongoing support from WEC.

This is both a Fellowship – a commitment to a set of learning opportunities to promote growth – and a paid position. Fellows must be willing and eager to commit to the responsibilities included here, especially PBL and professional development. This robust learning opportunity requires considerable independence and initiative and will be attractive to future employers.

Fellows' schedules vary by partner site placement. Most partner sites run from September to June. Fellows serve a minimum of 5 hours/week and may serve up to 8 hours/week depending on the partner site's schedule. WEC seeks Fellows who are willing to make a commitment to serve their entire academic year (September – May). Successful eligible Fellows may have the opportunity to continue their experience during the summer.

Woo-Labs is committed to building a cohort of Hanover Fellows reflective of the city's rich linguistic, racial, and ethnic identities and cultivating their skills and competencies to facilitate high-quality learning opportunities.

Responsibilities and Duties

- Engage directly with young people to build trusting, affirming relationships
- Develop and implement robust project-based learning activities
- Coordinate the collection of Woo-Labs measurement data, including:
 - o Collecting daily student attendance and parent/guardian consent forms
 - Implementing student and staff surveys
- Serve as a Woo-Labs liaison to build partner site staff's knowledge and capacity for Woo-Labs activities
- Support with site-specific parent engagement and student attendance promotion strategies
- Perform other site-specific responsibilities as needed

Required Knowledge, Skills, and Experiences

WEC seeks candidates who are:

- Experienced with and/or passionate about positive youth development
- Interested in K-12 education and/or out-of-school time programming
- Interested in project-based learning
- Skilled at relationship building and fostering supportive learning environments
- Able to work with individuals from various age groups and those with diverse learning styles and racial, cultural, and ethnic backgrounds
- Eager to advance educational and racial equity
- Organized, detail-oriented, and effective time managers and communicators
- Enthusiastic team players
- Flexible, eager learners

Preferred Knowledge, Skills, and Experiences

- Prior experience with K-6 age group
- Familiarity with Worcester community
- Enrolled in a relevant field of study at their college or university
- Bilingualism a plus

Compensation

Fellows will earn \$16.00 an hour. Fellows will serve approximately 225 hours total for total compensation of \$3,600. Please note that Fellows must complete a site-specific background check prior to working with youth.
